

Let's Track Your Dog's Itch!

Itch can present itself in different ways, including scratching, biting, and licking. Keep an eye on these signs and mark your dog's itch level each day to spot changes.

10. Extreme

Non-stop itching, severe discomfort. Dog needs to be physically restrained to stop itching.



8. Severe

Regular episodes of itching at night and during activities like eating or playing.



6. Moderate

Regular episodes of itching, often at night, but no itching during activities like eating or playing.



4. Mild

Infrequent episodes of itching, but not during activities like eating or playing.



2. Very Mild

Slight itching episodes, but not disruptive.



0. Normal

No itching.

Even when the scratching stops, allergies could be lurking. Long-term care and regular vet check-ins can be essential to keeping your dog comfortable.

4 Celebrate small wins

Every little win counts! Fewer scratches or less itching means your dog is on the path to feeling their best!
