## **TOP PRIORITY**

and requires appropriate shelter, disease prevention, veterinary care and treatment, and proper management.1

> Controlled temperatures keep animals warm in the winter and cool in the summer.1

Farmers continue to adopt best animal welfare practices, grounded in science, and work with experts to ensure any transitions are what's best for the animal.4

Indoor housing protects animals from disease and physical harm from predators.1

Indoor housing allows for better control of the animal's environment.

> Ventilation systems and fans circulate fresh air and reduce moisture levels.2

> > Animal nutritionists monitor food intake to ensure each animal is getting its fair share and the right nutrients at every stage of life.3

Providing shelter protects animals from predators and makes food readily available - animals don't have to look for food under a blanket of snow.1
