

A Sustainable Food Supply in Perspective

Sustainable food production is a balance between available resources and human needs.

Everyone in the food system has a role, and the key to moving forward is the willingness of everyone to take the next step toward sustainable food production.¹



By 2050:

The world population will grow to close to **10 billion people** and we will need **56 percent** more food to feed them.⁵

Sustainability and careful stewardship of land, water and energy resources is a priority for animal agriculture.



It takes **58% less** water and **72% less** land to produce the same amount of chicken than it did 1965.6



In 2018, GMOs allowed farmers to use 59 million **fewer acres** of land to produce the same amount of food, fuel and fiber crops than 1996.⁷



The **carbon footprint** of a gallon of milk has decreased by 19% since 2007.



Beef production has reduced their waste outputs and their carbon footprint by 16.3% since 1977.9
